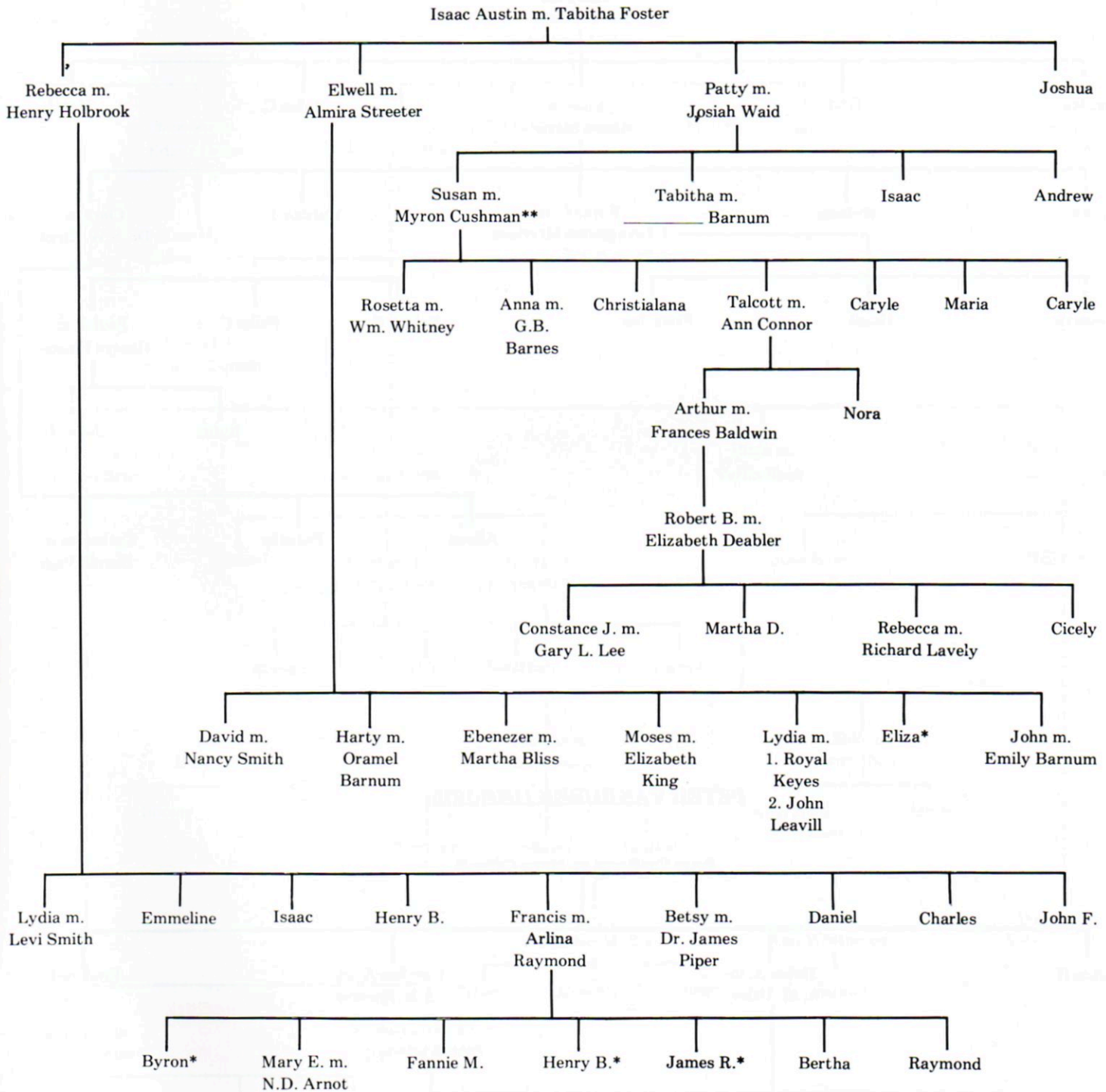

ISAAC AUSTIN (1772-1825)

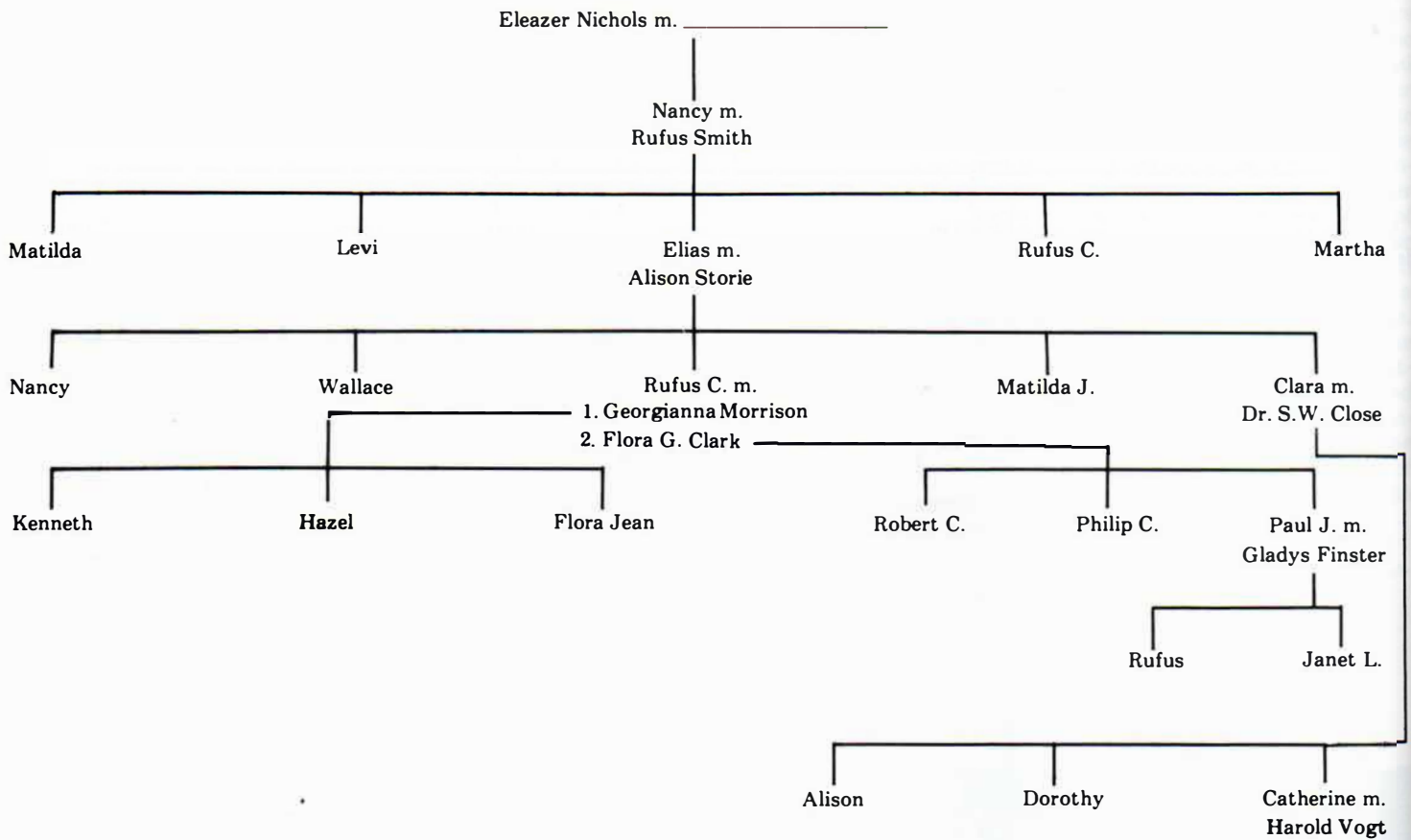

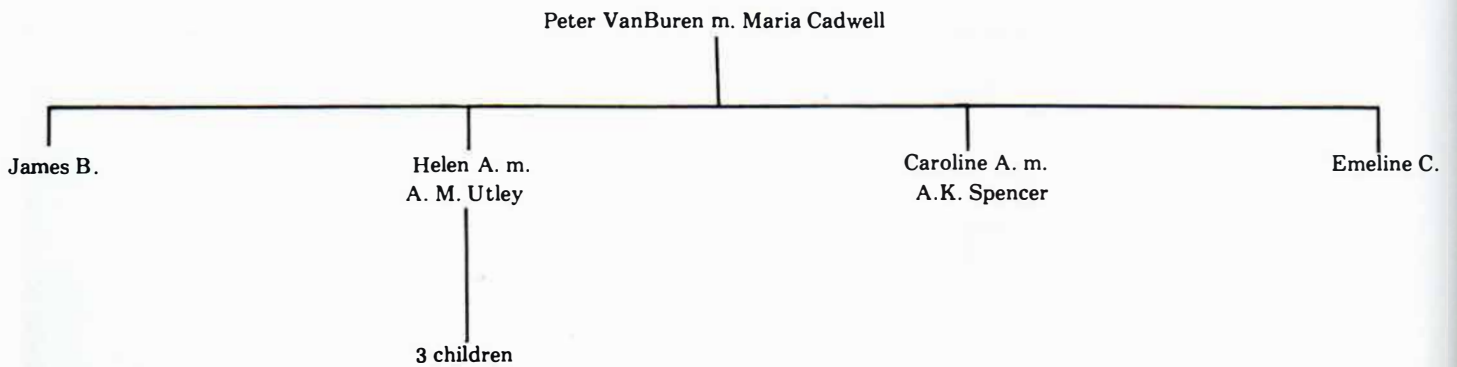

It is a pity that we have no more information on the descendants of Henry Holbrook and Elwell Austin, both prominent citizens of Gouverneur.

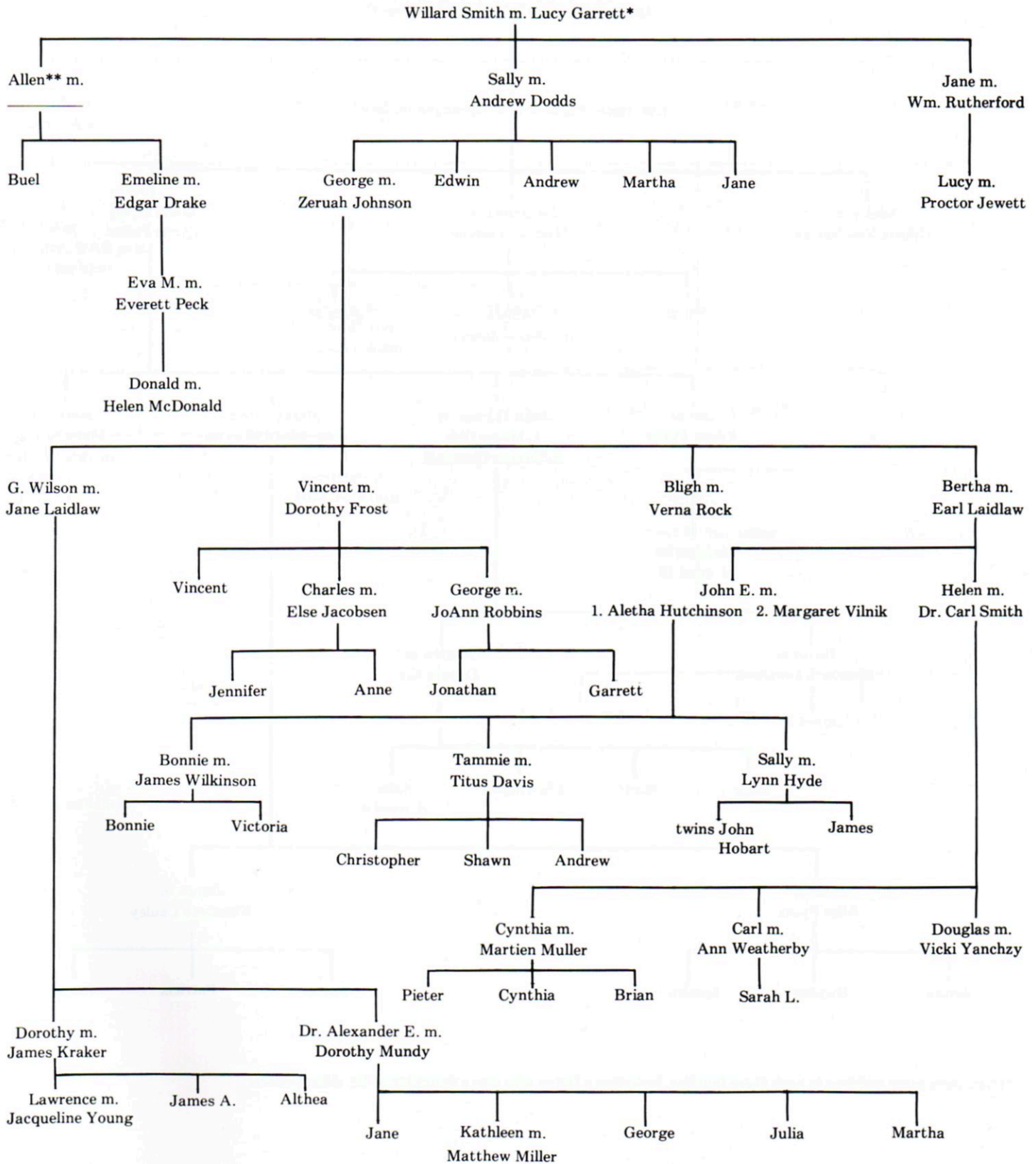
ELEAZER (ELEAZOR) NICHOLS



PETER VANBUREN (1803-1870)



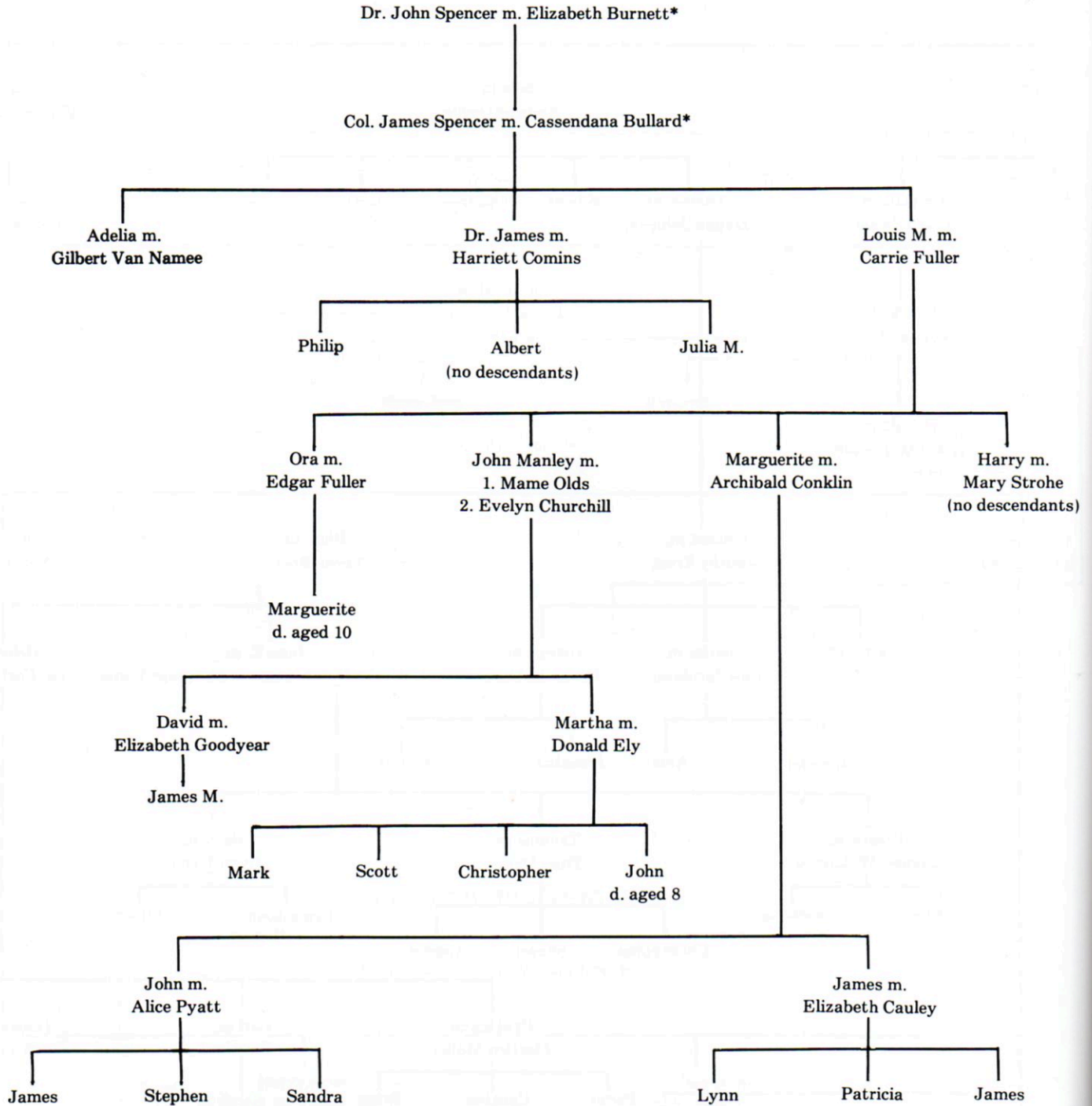
WILLARD SMITH (1784-1844)

**first white child born in Gouverneur

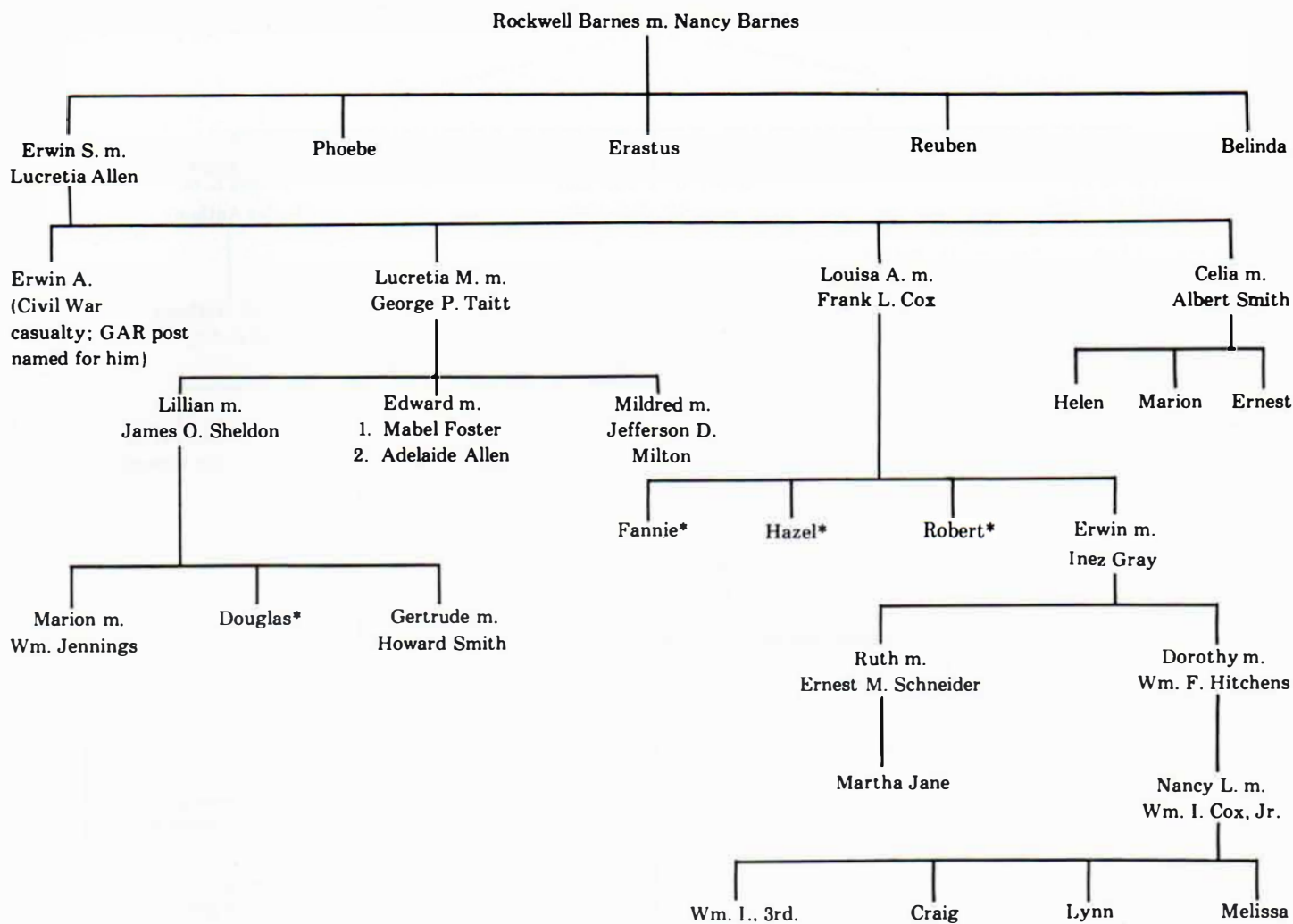
DR. JOHN SPENCER (1780 - 1855)



*There were other children in both these families, including a Betsy who was a daughter of Dr. John Spencer.

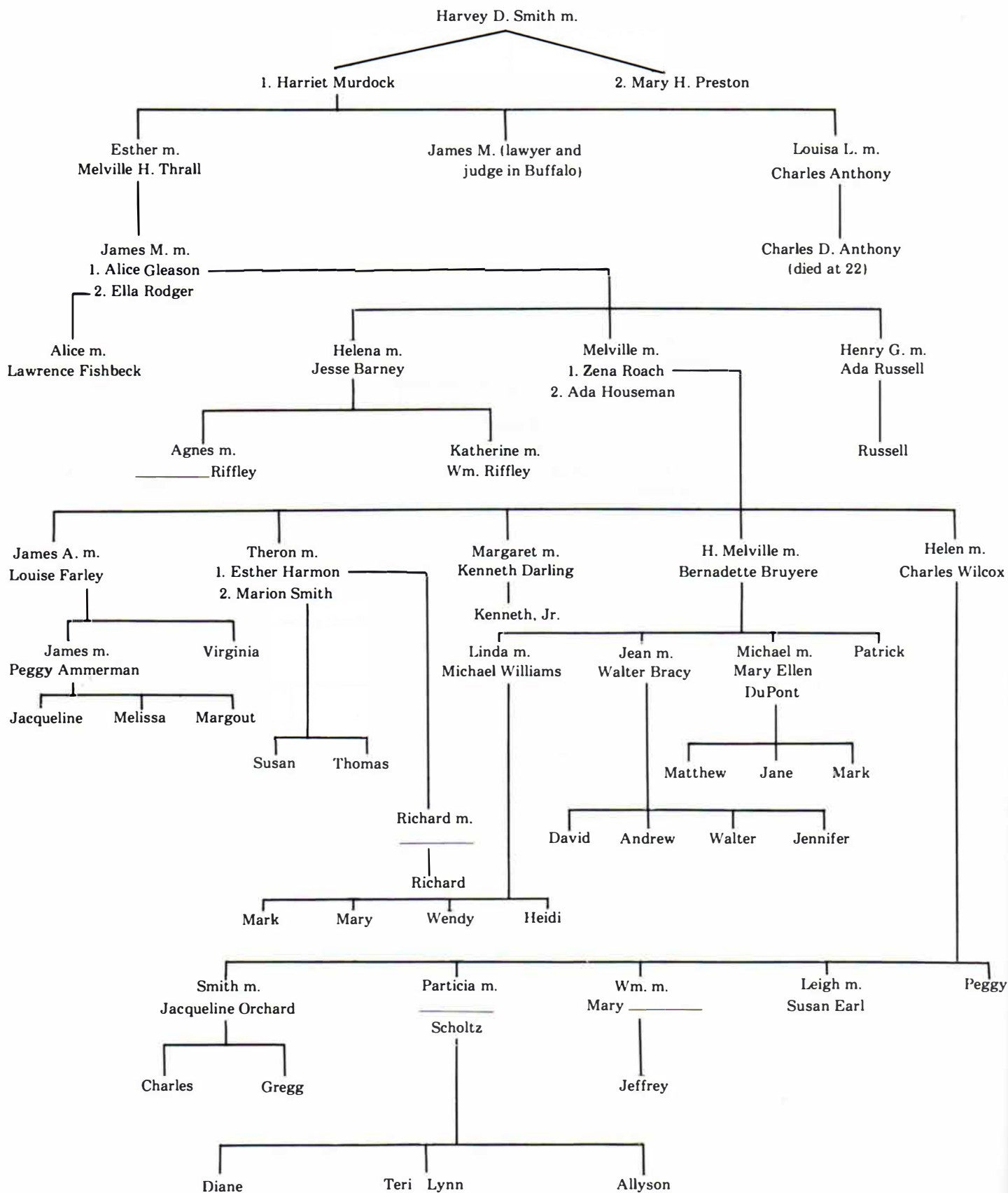
The Spencer house at 29 Trinity Avenue, now occupied by Mrs. J. Manley Spencer, was built by Bradford Smith in the 1840's and owned by Col. James Spencer. It was later the home of Gilbert Van Namee who married Adelia Spencer, and still later of Dr. Grosvenor Swan and Dr. S. V. Ross. It finally passed into the hands of Dr. James Spencer, who, with other members of the family, have resided in it since.

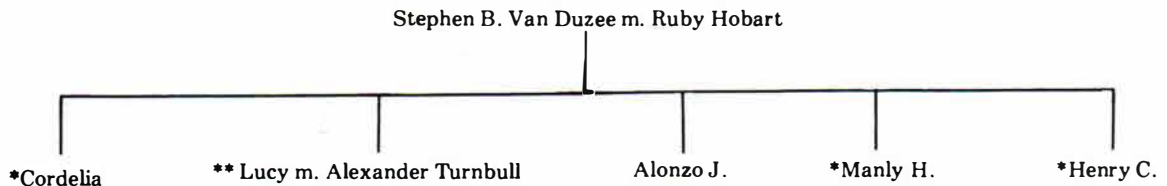
