

**GOUVERNEUR MAN LETTERS
QUENTIN ROOSEVELT TABLET**

Leland G. Easton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward C. Easton of Gouverneur, has the honor of cutting and lettering a monumental tablet erected in memory of Quentin Roosevelt, son of ex-President Theodore Roosevelt, who was killed during an aeroplane fight with German airmen July 14th last. His body was buried by the Germans at Fore en Tardenois on the spot where he fell and a slab erected to mark the grave. The above information was contained in a letter to Mr. Easton's father and received Friday, a portion of which reads as follows: "I have had the pleasure of cutting two stone jobs, one of which I lettered as follows: 'On this spot fell Quentin Roosevelt, son of ex-President Roosevelt, July 14, 1918; erected as a memorial by the 302nd Engineers.'" Leland, or "Pom", as he was most familiarly known, was a stone cutter in the employ of the Scholton Marble Works here before entering the service and was an expert workman. He was very popular among the younger element and for many years was a member of the Gouverneur Fire Department and baseball team. He entrained with the fourth contingent from this district, leaving here February 23 for Camp Devens. He was later transferred to the engineer's division and sailed for overseas March 27. He is now a member of Company A, of the 302d Engineers Regiment.—Northern Tribune.
