

**Gouverneur Paragraphs.**

Gouverneur, March 21.— ....

Robert McCall, who has severed his connection with the Gouverneur Marble company as foreman of their plant in this village, and gone to work for the White Crystal Marble company, is at work at this quarry on the Hall farm in North Gouverneur with a gang of men, getting the plant there in shape for the resumption of operations soon. The present mill will probably be enlarged by the addition of more gang saws and the quarry pit will be enlarged by the uncovering of more stock. Since the construction of the Horton mansion in Middletown of this marble, the demand has grown steadily until today it exceeds the supply. The marble at the White Crystal property is of good quality and pure white in color. Mr. McCall said recently when interviewed as to a possible reopening of the quarry, that the new company which will take charge of the operations, has sufficient capital in hand to operate the plant on a large scale and the latest improved and up-to-date quarry machinery would be installed. He said it might be possible that the stone would be hauled over the four miles of highway to this village on cars drawn by traction engines.
